Annual EHPA-Maddocks Professional Excellence Awards

The Annual EHPA-Maddocks Professional Excellence Awards celebrate the success of individuals and organisations working within the environmental health profession that focus on initiatives that demonstrate excellence and which have been impacted by the environmental health practice.

Objectives of Awards

The Annual EHPA-Maddocks Professional Excellence Awards aim to:

- Recognise the outstanding contributions and achievements to the environmental health profession by an individual environmental health practitioner or organisation;
- Promote the role of environmental health practitioners as to increase community awareness of environmental health;
- Encourage environmental health practitioners to recognise the professional development of their peers and provide a profession that nurtures excellence in environmental health.

Award Categories

The awards are judged on the criteria associated with each award category below and are presented to the deserving nominees at EHPA's Annual Professional Development Symposium. Each award recipient will receive a certificate and a cheque, sponsored by Maddocks. The award selection committee, at their discretion, may make an additional acknowledgement of high commendation for any award category.

It is the responsibility of the nominating individual to determine which category the candidate they are nominating should be entered based on the award criteria discussed below. No nominee may be entered in more than one category.

Nominations are to be submitted to the Executive Officer by 24th August 2018.

Award Criteria

The following will be considered for all award nominees:

- Represents an outstanding contribution to the environmental health profession;
- Goes beyond what is standard practice within the profession; and
- Is directly attributable to the nominee and can be clearly singled out or distinguished from the work of other people.

The nomination and supporting material must be able to show the nominee's achievement. Nominations should indicate specific instances of how the requirements of the award criteria have been substantially fulfilled by the nominee.

Eligibility

Each award nominee must meet the selection criteria of the award category. Nominees must be financial members of EHPA at the time of nomination. However, nominees for the Undergraduate of the Year and Post Graduate of the Year awards may be either student or graduate members of EHPA at the time of nomination.

Process for Nomination

A completed nomination form along with a supporting statement should be submitted by 24th August 2018.

Depending on the Award, Candidates may be self-nominated or nominated by a colleague who has knowledge of the candidates achievements.

Supporting Statement

All nominations must be accompanied by a supporting statement, which must provide details of particular achievements to support the nomination (500-750 words).

The supporting statement must provide sufficient information to demonstrate to the selection committee the outstanding qualities and/or significant achievement of the environmental health practitioner or organisation leading to their nomination of the award and must address the individual award criteria.

Additional attachments can be submitted but should support the information provided in the candidate's supporting Statement, e.g. Curriculum Vitae, reports, certificates, photographs and testimonials.
