Are the guidelines legally enforceable?



‘These guidelines are intended to assist those involved in the hair, beauty and skin penetration industries to comply with the PHWA and the PHWR’

‘These guidelines should be used as a guide to best practice and as a reference tool for people associated with the industry, including EHOs’



Inconsistency of law

What happens if there are inconsistencies between the PHWR and guidelines?



Compliance inconsistencies

What happens if a person complies with the PHWR but not with the guidelines?

What happens if a person complies with the guidelines but not the PHWR?



How should the guidelines be used?

'If you do not comply with the guidelines, you may be prosecuted.'

'If you comply with the guidelines, you will be compliant with the requirements under PHWR.'

'If you fail to comply with a requirement of the guidelines, you will contravene the PHWR.'
