



What is an emergency?



"Means an emergency due to the actual or imminent occurrence of an event which in any way endangers or threatens to endanger the safety or health of any person in Victoria or which destroys or damages or threatens to destroy or damage any property in Victoria, or endangers or threatens to endanger the environment or an element of the environment in Victoria." S3 Definitions Emergency Management Act 2013

EM Legislation



There are three key roles that each council must have under state legislation:

- the MERO, required under the EM Act 1986
- the MFPO, required under MFB Act 1958 and the CFA Act 1958, and
- the EHO, required by the Public Health and Wellbeing Act 2008

Councils have a wide range of emergency management obligations under other Victorian legislation. These include:

- Planning and Environment Act 1987,
- Public Health and Wellbeing Act 2008,
- Building Act 1993,
- Electricity Safety Act 1998,
- Water Act 1989 / Safe Drinking Water Act 2003
- Local Government Act 1989
- Food Act 1984

- Municipal Emergency Management Plan (MEMP)
- Municipal Emergency Resources Officer (MERO)
- Municipal Fire Prevention Officer (MFPO)
- Municipal Recovery Manager (MRM)
- Emergency Management Coordinator *MEMO

Planning & Mitigation (Prevention)

- Community Emergency Risk Assessment (CERA)
- Community resilience "all community, all hazards"

Relief support

- Emergency Relief Centres /shelter Emergency food & water
- Psychological First Aid






Local Government roles and responsibilities

Recovery - 4 Pillars of Recovery

"The purpose of providing recovery services is to assist the affected community towards management of its own recovery. Where a community experiences a significant emergency or disaster there is a need to supplement the personal, family and community structures that have been disrupted."

Emergency Management Cycle




FIGURE 1: EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT CYCLE¹

WHY:


Environmental Health Professionals Australia

- Protect the community and emergency management public health personnel from health risks generated by an emergency or incident
- Be proactive in taking preventative action to minimise the spread of public health risks

Increase awareness and knowledge of community public health

risks to build community resilience





Public Health EM Planning



HOW:

- Development of a Public Health EM Plan (sub-plan)
- Development of SOPs / supporting operational strategies
- Participation in CERA process and review
- Establish stakeholder and agency networks (REHO, DHHS Regional EM Coordinator
- MOU Agreements/ MAV resource sharing agreement
- Information & communication management
- Equipment maintenance and suppliers
- Training/exercises/review
- Incident/Emergency Debriefs



Public Health Issues in Emergencies

Environmental Health

- Provision of safe and adequate water
- Shelter
- Food and food related issues
- Emergency ablution facilities
- Wastewater treatment
- Refuse collection and disposal
- Vermin and vector control
- Infectious disease control
- Disinfection and cleaning
- Environmental hazards
- Community recovery mass gathering events





Role of the EHO in emergencies



- Emergency Relief Centre Venue assessment and management
- Donated goods/foods
- Emergency affected housing
- Secondary impact assessments
- Issues management
- Information provision
- MECC/EMLO role
- Other public health duties
- Community recovery planning
